A BILL FOR AN ACT
TO APPROPRIATE FUNDING FOR DISTRIBUTING METAL STRAWS, REUSABLE
UTENSILS, AND POST-CONSUMER PENS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT SENATE:

SECTION I. PURPOSE

Encouraging sustainable practices within the full-time classified undergraduate student community is an ASUH initiative to ensure greater stewardship for Hawaiian lands. A means to largely foster a local conservational culture occurs by promoting the usage of environmental oriented products such as reusable utensils and compostable materials.

In the past, metal straws have been distributed by ASUH, increasing awareness and usage of ecological based alternatives. The purchasing of eco-friendly items reinforces ASUH’s commitment to socially responsive investing and thus forwards a greener movement on campus and ultimately into the ‘āina. Metal straws, reusable cutlery, and post-consumer pens will be purchased to handed when conducting outreach for upcoming events like the annual on-campus Earth Day event and etc.

SECTION II. APPROPRIATIONS

A total of \$2350.00 shall be appropriated from Senate Account #3325232 (University Programs, Services and Support).

SECTION III. PROVISIONS

The items purchase should be comprised with post-consumer materials, or any other resources that support sustainable practices. The distribution of materials is only allotted for current full-time classified UH Mānoa undergraduates.

SECTION IV. Any unexpended and unencumbered balance of any appropriation of this Act, as of the close of business on May 1, 2019 shall lapse into Senate Account #3325232.

SECTION V. The Treasurer is authorized to draw upon said account.

SECTION IV. This act shall take effect upon approval by the Senate.
