A RESOLUTION

Supporting Palestine and Palestinian Freedom and Calling for an Immediate Ceasefire in the Gaza Strip

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNDERGRADUATE SENATE:

WHEREAS, the Associated Students of the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa

Senate is the elected body representing approximately 11,000

full-time classified undergraduate students; and,

WHEREAS, the conflict between Israel and Palestine has been escalating for

decades for several reasons, but namely due to religious persecution,

foreign governance involvement, land rights¹; and,

WHEREAS, this has led to increasing tensions, hostility, casualties, and violence,

such as the Arab-Israeli War of 1948 and the Six-Day War of 1967 where millions of Palestinians were forced off their homelands,

effectively becoming refugees²; and,

WHEREAS, the Israeli government has continued to build illegal settlements³ on

Palestinian land, contributing to further displacement of Palestinian

residents; and,

WHEREAS, as of 2023, over 2 million people total live in United Nations

Recognized Palestinian refugee camps⁴ which span the Gaza Strip, with Palestinian Refugees and their descendants making up nearly

two-thirds of the Gaza Strip population⁵; and,

WHEREAS,	following the election of the Hamas in 2007, the Israeli government has imposed a blockade on land, air, and sea. Thus, the Gaza Strip is dependent on Israel for water, electricity, telecommunication, and other utilities ⁶ ; and,
WHEREAS,	this has severely diminished the quality of life of Gaza Residents, with 63% of residents food insecure or dependent on international assistance, 44.6% of the population unemployed, and 95% of the population unable to access clean water ⁷ ; and,
WHEREAS,	the Israeli forces have continued to attack the already fragile Gaza population (e.g., the 50-day Israeli attack in 2014 where over 2,000 Palestinians were killed and the 2021 attack by Israeli forces where more than 200 Palestinians were killed) ⁸ ; and,
WHEREAS,	on October 7th, 2023, the governing Palestinian militant group Hamas launched an attack against Israel. Following this, Israel declared war on Hamas ⁹ , and thus, Palestinians who reside in the Gaza Strip; and,
WHEREAS,	to counter, Israel's government has completely stopped the supply of electricity, food, water, sanitation, and fuel to Gaza, worsening the humanitarian crisis there ¹⁰ ; and
WHEREAS,	Israel has also responded with an alarming number of airstrikes–nearly 400 air strikes ¹¹ in one day in one instance–which has resulted overall in over 8,000 deaths ¹² and 15,000 injuries in Gaza, and over 1 million Gaza residents displaced; and,
WHEREAS,	the atrocities enacted are incredibly concerning seeing that the Gaza Strip is only 140 square miles, roughly the size of Las Vegas, which makes it one of the most densely populated places on earth; and,

WHEREAS,	seeing no end in sight, the casualties are growing at a gravely concerning rate, not only due to airstrike violence but also due to dwindling supplies ¹⁵ ; and,
BE IT RESOLVED,	the ASUH strongly condemns the actions of the Israeli government during this time; and,
BE IT RESOLVED,	the ASUH echoes the sentiments of numerous human rights organizations and fearless Palestinian advocates, fighters, and residents who are pleading for an immediate ceasefire in the Gaza Strip; and,
BE IT RESOLVED,	the ASUH is committed to advocating and extending our unwavering support to all those affected by the Israel-Palestine conflict, especially innocent civilians and Palestinians who have been displaced and are experiencing their community's trauma; and,
BE IT RESOLVED,	the ASUH, deeply empathizing with the continual struggle against land occupation, firmly stands with Palestine and stands with Palestinian liberation; and,
BE IT RESOLVED,	the ASUH is calling for the University of Hawai'i to take a vocal and unapologetic stance supporting Palestine, Palestinian freedom, and Palestinian students and faculty; and,
BE IT RESOLVED,	the ASUH is calling for the University of Hawai'i to respect students' right to use their free speech to support Palestine without fear of retaliation; and,
BE IT RESOLVED,	the ASUH is calling for the University of Hawai'i to take immediate actions to support Palestinian students' academic, social, emotional,

financial, and cultural well-being; and,
