## Official Correspondence

a. Dr. Joannie Dobbs, Assistant Specialist For Food Composition and Health Education

Human Nutrition, Food and Animal Sciences

Dr. Joannie Dobbs We are addressing student hunger here and creating a soup kitchen with a grab and go

breakfast, and we have received funding from SAPFB. USDA has a questionnaire for the

past year about food insecurity. Question 12A is very important which was marked by many students, did not eat for whole day for 3+ months. In the spring right before exams, 558 adequately completed the survey and were not dieting or were just too busy to eat. 50% of the undergrads were food secure but 13% didn't have hunger but the quality was with things like saimin. Severe hunger were 27% of those that submitted. They could write comments and the stories are heartbreaking, not having cooking utilities, 5 students in one bedroom living in cars, things that are not helpful in education. All ethnicities are included, and it affects health. 5 years ago before there was a charge to see me I was seeing a lot of food insecurity. We have an outstanding amount of individuals who are depressed and that does occur with malnutrition. Some people say that they can't hang out with friends because they have no money, and instead say they need to study and it does contribute to anxiety. The average food insecure with hunger was less than \$3 and or less than \$3 for food. Average cost of lunch on campus is over \$7. There are some solutions such as volunteering, food pantries that were brought up that were acceptable for students. Our hardest logistics was places that we could put this. We have a website finding food on campus so that students can find where they can look for food. Our goal right now is to have carts with grab and go food in CTAR, QLC, and am talking with athletics to have it there. Sometimes the athletes might be required having a certain amount of calories but only able to get a certain amount, that is starvation and they are nauseous. In about a few months we are planning about 100-150 carts in 4+ locations. You guys will help a lot in helping to find locations of these carts, and I don't know how important you guys are.

Senator Simeona

In the community college we started a food pantry before, so I really like the idea of the mini carts. Is there any plan in place for the mini food pantries?

Dr. Joannie Dobbs

I got 4 places that have said yes, I would like to see one in every building on campus. I'm trying to write grants hopefully to get one or two. The idea is to try to build partnerships with everybody.

SAL Lao

How much does the food cart cost, and you needed someone to help with finding locations for the carts?

Dr. Joannie Dobbs

We have a group that really need it too so we don't want it to make it so that everyone doesn't just go just for free food. The lounge areas would be the perfect place, and since this is for undergraduates I understand it should undergraduates. The next push is to send a box of food and it was things that aren't selling. Part of the reason for obesity for poorer communities were peanut butter, flour, things like that. It was a lot of food, but not the food that was needed. Get a conversation going with people, and I never told one person that I was food insecure because I was so embarrassed.

### **Testimony**

Isak Kim

I represent the perception and retention research lab as a lab manager in the department of psychology. The mission and purpose of a lab is to provide undergraduates and graduate students with knowledge and research experience in the field of cognitive science. This year what the lab is planning to host is a cognitive psychology seminar with the title of the art of change blindness and misdirection. People tend to miss the things you see on the side but the things that are right in front of you are the most difficult to see. For example do any of you remember what your bottom right icon on your phone is? Close your eyes. What am I wearing? What does all of this have to do with cognitive psychology, what do magic shows have anything to do with it? We deal with how people make inferences in the world, finding patterns, how individuals can be left astray. The seminar will mess with people's minds and exploit your cognitive blindness with misdirection.

d. Update from the Undergraduate Legislative Fellow

HB 2255 relating to college corps hasn't had anything happen since january 26th, but has passed first reading. SB 2328 regarding OER on February 6th the higher ed recommended that it pass with amendment and has not been referred to WAM. HB 1830 is the green special fund and on february 6th it was recommended that it be passed with amendments.

SB 2317 and 2318 are the two BOR bills and on january 22nd both passed first reading and was referred to higher ed and judiciary but hasn't made any progress since. SB 2329 is the one relating to tuition cap based on median household income, HB 2089 is the one relating to tuition assistance for the national guard and both had hearings on february 13th by the higher ed committee. The tuition assistance one was passed without amendments. The tuition cap was passed with amendments. 2316 and 2319 had a hearing this morning, 2316 was passed unammendended, 2319 passed amended.

our logo on it. Most of it would be the cost of printing.

SAL Leval I feel like if we funded food and food supplies for the other bill, we should give some to

this event.

Advisor Manini I think it is important to think about the experiences you create for undergraduates. Do

the benefits outweigh the expense is what you would have to get down to, even in RIO funding you can't really control that. Sometimes others that aren't undergraduates may

directly or indirectly benefit from this.

SAL Leval Move to add \$300 of food and food supplies and have the total reflect the changes.

Senator Ramirez We are constantly striking down the price of food but I know Maggie mentioned that we

still have about \$71,000 leftover in our funds.

Senator Li There is a lot of discussing about food but it is important to think about the event as a

whole, it is about a mixer so the food is just an addition to that. It's important to be efficient but we have to take a look at the bigger picture, getting students together with

professors.
