BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT SENATE:

SECTION I <u>PURPOSE</u>

STOLES AND CORDS

The Associated Students of the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa (ASUH) senate members are committed members of the student government. The efforts put forth by the ASUH senators are an act of service to their constituents. The work and passion that is exhibited by senate members are deemed as commendable and should be recognized.

The University of Hawai'i at Mānoa commencement ceremony is an appropriate time to commend graduating senators for their time serving on the ASUH senate. Purchasing of graduation stoles and cords can be worn as a reward for their work on the senate. The purchase will include stoles that are specific to ASUH including green and white honor cords. The stoles ordered are all the same design. The cords will also be the same design. To receive an ASUH graduation stole, graduating senators must be current members of the ASUH senate. To receive an honor cord, one must have previously served or is still currently serving as an ASUH Senator. The appropriations shall cover 100 stoles and 100 cords to include taxes and shipping/handling.
