Chelsea Gonsalves Hi, my name is Chelsea.

Kate Magno And I'm Kate.

Chelsea Gonsalves Today we're going to propose to you the Student Health fee increase.

Kate Magno Before we begin, I'm going to introduce to you what the Student Health fee is. The

Student Health fee, not to be confused with health insurance, is actually an overall operational cost for our Health Services here at Mānoa. Currently, our fee is \$116.00 per semester at \$46.00 per summer session. Before you ask the question if we're going to

implement the price increase this semester, we won't.

Chelsea Gonsalves This is a graphic of our peer and benchmark comparisons. Our peer institutions are

universities that are at our level. We have similar missions. Our benchmark institutions are like our big brother/sister institutions. They're a little bit bigger and we actually have the opportunity to partner with them to hit new goals. The left shows our fee and we are ranked the lowest compared to these institutions. The highest is Colorado State

University at \$200.00. You can see where we stand in the spectrum.

Kate Magno We want to increase by \$10.00 each semester. For the summer sessions, we are asking for

\$4.00. We will be implementing this for the next five years. It will be ending in the 2022-

2023 academic year.

Chelsea Gonsalves We conducted a client satisfaction survey. Employees sat outside the clinic and we gave

patients this survey. We wanted to know how we're doing and how we can improve. We highlighted three questions. The first question is: how was your overall interaction with the staff of University Health Services? We got some pretty positive feedback. 95% of people said very good/good, 4% said satisfactory, and only 1% saying somewhat poor. Moving onto the next question: would you recommend University Health Services to a friend or colleague? We got similar positive feedback. 91% said yes, only 1% said no, and 8% saying not sure/depends. This last question is one of the most important questions: would you support an increase in the health fee to allow University Health Services to enhance health care and health promotion services? We got some pretty good

feedback with 69% saying yes and 31% saying no.

Kate Magno With the fee we have right now, we have primary care, women's health, sports medicine,

psychiatry, dermatology, nutrition, travel medicine, immunizations, health clearance, pharmacy, medical laboratory, peer/health education, alcohol and substance abuse

counseling, and health insurance options.

Chelsea Gonsalves To continue with the services we provide. Not many students know this, but the money

the health fee provides, a percent of it does go to the Counseling and Student Development Center. Some of the services they provide are personal counseling, couples/group counseling, career counseling, peer mentor services, psychiatric services,

and emergency/crisis services.

Kate Magno So why do we need the fee increase? We need to maintain current and expand clinical

services, provide additional support for comprehensive mental health services, expand health promotion throughout the campus community, and promote campus wide health

and safety efforts through immunization.

Chelsea Gonsalves To go into that in further detail. We want to create a specialized airborne isolation room.

In the unfortunate occurrence that there is a highly infectious disease on campus, we want to be sure that we are protecting all of our students. When you're waiting in the waiting room, you don't want to be sitting next to someone who is coughing up a virus. We want to create an isolation room so we can keep our students safe. The next item is pandemic planning and emergency response. We want education outreach and prevention efforts so everyone knows how to protect themselves and so that students know if they have a virus. Educational fliers are really, really helpful. This last item is that we want to expand mental health services and suicide prevention, which is a very big issue. We would be able to support the current staff at CSDC and they also have very good ideas that they

want to adopt. One example is adopting a peer mentorship program.

Kate Magno

Now we're going to move onto expanding health promotion efforts. Our first point here states, partnership for Healthier America-Healthier Campus Initiative, which is Michelle Obama's project that used to be K through 12, but now it goes to college. Fun fact: the University of Hawaii at Mānoa is the first Native Hawaiian school to join the program and this is our first semester that we're doing it. To kick this off, we have an event tomorrow in front of Hawaii Hall. We're doing yoga to show health and wellness. The next is Student Health 101. I actually have the privilege of being the campus correspondent for that. What it is is a monthly online magazine and it's a lot of good

content about college, health, and wellness. We talk about things like dealing with your roommate, how to prepare for finals, how to go to the gym when you don't have time, or how to eat healthy when you're on a budget. Part of my job is to provide content or articles about things happening off campus.

Kate Magno

Next is educational outreach in classrooms and residence halls. We often go to housing and give presentations on STIs, how to avoid sleep deprivation, and other things. We also go to classrooms and give presentations on how to de-stress.

Chelsea Gonsalves

The next one is that we're trying to reduce student food insecurities. This is already being tackled through the food bank, which is awesome, but how we want to approach it is through a partnership with Sodexo. We got to sit down with Sodexo and they mentioned to us that they would be willing to provide food vouchers. Food vouchers could be given to CSDC or the clinic. If a student is mentioning to a counselor or doctor that they're stressed and haven't eaten anything, they'd be able to get a food voucher and go to Hale Aloha or Campus Center and get a meal.

Kate Magno

Our last point is student internships and practicums. We have Sarah here who is an intern with the Health Promotions office. She's actually using it to do her applied learning experience for her undergrad Public Health degree. We will be able to bring in more interns so more students can learn what it's like to work in the health industry.

Chelsea Gonsalves

Lastly, as students who work in Health Promotions, we want to be sure that they Student Health Advisory Committee was on board with the increase and they said yes. We took an extra step by asking patients if they would support the increase and the majority of them did say yes. Now we're hoping that you all can take this information and support the increase. If you look at the bigger picture, we just want to create a campus where student life can improve.

Senator Hortizuela

You only showed us three of your survey questions. What were the other questions and what were the responses?

Chelsea Gonsalves

The other questions pertain more toward the services at the clinic. We asked what services patients went in for and how long it took for them to see a doctor.

Dr. Kristen Scholly

We also asked if the provider was able to answer all of the patient's questions. They chose to present only these questions because it pertains to the health fee increase.

Treasurer Honda

How many students actually utilize health services compared to the benchmark schools that you compare UH to?

Chelsea Gonsalves

I can't really speak for the other universities.

Dr. Kristen Scholly

On average, there is about 100 visits per day at the clinic. Sometimes it is a little more or less depending what time of the year that it is. Mental and physical health care is extremely important. We are on the lower end of the spectrum compared to other universities, which we want to stay at.

Treasurer Honda

I think this proposal is really good compared to other fee increase proposals ASUH has seen. For example, the parking increase is an increase by a ridiculous percentage.

SAL Li

Going back to the slide that lists what you're going to invest the fee increase in, is there a priority or are the funds going to be distributed equally? One of our initiatives this year is to expand mental health services.

Dr. Kristen Scholly

The CSDC will benefit from the fee increase. They usually take about 20% of the fee and use it for preventative services. With increase stress level and increase mental health concerns, we want more support services. CSDC just did the Love Life event, which was a really good event about suicide prevention. This is the kind of things they do with the fee.

Senator Ganoy Dr. Kristen Scholly How do you exercise transparency with how you use the funds?

All of that information is presented when we do these fee increase proposals so that is

available if anyone is interested in looking at that.

Senator Ganoy Dr. Kristen Scholly Would you be willing to do more animal services on campus?

We have brought in the Human Society and their animals multiple times to help people

destress and we can definitely do more of that.

SAL Kim

Dr. Kristen Scholly

Could you talk more about the implementation of the peer-mentor services in CSDC? That is in the process right now. That is one thing that some of our peer/benchmarks do really well that we want to follow. The psychologists at CSDC are friendly, but sometimes people who come in would rather talk to a peer. We want upper division students working with other students. It's a win-win situation for both sides.

Could you explain more about other programs you all are trying to implement? CSDC has been trying to expand a lot of their programs and they are also trying to make

mental health services less scary. They are trying to expand group sessions and trying to make themselves more friendly and non-threatening as they much as they can. There's

still a stigma with getting help when someone's feeling depressed. Are there any plans to have a mental health first aid on campus?

Dr. Kristen Scholly

A lot of universities do have this, but we don't. I think there should be person to person contact, but this does heighten the fear factor. Having a peer mentor or someone help identify an issue with your mental health does really help.

Testimony

SAL Negrillo

Laurel Perun

Hi, my name is Laurel. I am a part of the Surfrider Foundation that we have here on campus. I'm here to testify on why we should reduce the use of plastic straws here at UH. This will give us an opportunity to serve as an example for other schools across America. Every single piece of plastic that has ever been created still exists in some form and this plastic is polluting our oceans, which is terrible. By doing this, we can set an example for Hawaii and tell other businesses to stop using plastic straws. It takes 500 years for plastic to turn into microplastic, which the fish eat and if you're eating this fish you are also getting it into your system. This is an amazing opportunity for UH to be an example for many other universities and other businesses.

Dominique

I'm Donique and I'm the President of Surfrider. Thank you for re-introducing this resolution and continuing this effort. It has gained a lot of support. I hear that you all are trying to reduce plastic use on campus, which is amazing and this plastic straw campaign will really change the student body. Last semester, we've had almost 1,000 signatures. Now, between our written petition and our online petition, we have about 2,000 signatures. We're doing really well. A lot of people have heard about the campaign through social media and come up to me and tell me that they want to get involved. We have really seen more students getting involved and are unifying them. It is so awesome that you all are getting involved with this movement. Surfrider National heard about what we're doing and featured UH Mānoa and the work we're doing to reduce plastic use. This shows that our campaign is really spreading throughout the country. In our online petition, I believe 7 different states are represented so this campaign is spreading.

Written testimony from Axl Reitz Daguio:

I am here to promote reduction of the use of straws at the University of Hawaii at Mānoa. Mānoa discards an estimated amount of 50,000 straws daily, according to the Surfrider Foundation. This large amount contributes to the ever-growing problem known as plastic pollution which has detrimental effects on the environment and the wildlife that inhabit it. There are many cases that have shown the death of sea animals due to their encounters with plastics. I have also seen animals being inconvenienced due to the consumption of plastics. I grew up in the Philippines where plastics were a necessity of life; plastic bags were used to carry groceries from the local store and would often end up floating around

the neighborhood. Without knowledge of the consequences of consuming plastics, the dogs around my neighborhood would eat the plastic. I remember quite vividly when a dog had trouble defecating due to the plastic that would not flow out of its digestive system. Not only was the plastic affecting the animals, but it was tarnishing the beauty of the Philippines. My parents had informed me of the beauty they experienced growing up in the Philippines, but when they took my siblings and I to see it for ourselves, they were sorely disappointed. They were faced with garbage and plastics polluting the sea, rivers, waterfalls, and farmlands. Unfortunately, the situation has not improved for the Philippines; plastics are still regularly trashed, and it is evident by the pollution of Manila Bay. The current situation in the Philippines is a possible future for Hawaii. Hawaii has already accumulated over 20,000 pieces of debris on its beaches and most of it is plastic. If we do not prevent the growing pollution not only will we be contributing to the deaths of animals, but also the eventual loss of Hawaii's beauty. We must act so that we can ensure that Hawaii's beauty will be eternal. We can do this with one small step at a time, beginning with our campus.

Written testimony from Alonzo Alvarez:

Aloha ASUH, my name is Alonzo Alvarez, I am currently a Freshman attending UH Mānoa

It is time to make a change. There is an ongoing issue that us humans are causing to our environment. Water pollution with the main culprit being plastic. Plastic was originally created to be a cheaper material that was to be used productively. However, us humans have taken the idea of plastic being a cheap resource for granted. Plastic is a material that is made up of polymers that break down into micro-plastics; that animals in the ocean consume, which in turn then enters our food chain. As an co-owner of 'Sebay' a surf resort in the Philippines; visually seeing plastic bottles and waste on the beach is concerning and is a very serious issue that must be sorted out.

How can we make a change? We can start by removing all plastic straws that are being used in/on our campus. According to statistics by students of UH Mānoa, on average, 500 million plastic straws are used and discarded everyday in United States. Approximately 18 million plastic straws are used and discarded every year on the UH Mānoa campus alone. This statistic shows that we could possibly remove 18 million plastic straws, it is not much compared to 500 million, but the removal of straws in our university can definitely start a change.

However, we don't need to completely erase straws in our campus, there are alternatives. Starbucks, a coffee company, has recently announced at July, that the company will start using brand new lids for their cold drink products that will be released in phases. Another alternative that could be used, for smoothies and shakes, are new biodegradable straws that will eventually break down into micro-organisms, straws that are made up of paper. Lastly, we can have steel straws that are reusable and purchasable used for cold drinks. It is time for a change, and that change starts with the removal of plastic straws in UH Mānoa.

Written testimony from Simone Grant:

Dear ASUH, my name is Simone' Grant, and I am a freshman majoring in sociology. Your students at the university of hawaii at Mānoa would like to bring it to your attention of the possible side effects of using plastic straws at UH. Students have watched documentaries, and read different articles pertaining to the usage of wasteful, and harmful plastic straws. We have critically thought about how unnecessary plastic usage is, and most importantly plastic straws on our campus. Single-use plastic straws provided on campus, are not only a waste but also very dangerous to our environment, and marine life that come across it. All plastic turns into toxic gasses after they are broken down, and it causes terrible harm. Some whales mistake them as food like krill, and can die tragic, painful, unbearable deaths from consuming plastic products including straws. We want to push to advocate for our environment, animals, and marine life by aiming to ban straws

from UH campuses. By banning straws from all University of hawaii campuses we will be one step closer to conserving our ecosystems, and we can find helpful, and still efficient alternatives for our campus dining locations, such as using biodegradable paper straws so we can reduce the major-use of single-use plastic at our beloved campuses. I hope everybody on campus wants to join a movement in order to avoid damage to our environment, and marine life at all costs by banning plastic straws from UH.
