c. Senate Resolution 20-14: In Support of a Moratorium on Tuition Increase at the UH Mānoa for the 2014-2015 Academic Year

- Vice-President Koethe* Motion to change on the second to the last dash, amend to all instances of “Associated Students of the University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa” to read “ASUH” and all instances of “University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa” to read “UHM”, excluding the first instances of each.
- Senator Burk* Second.

- Senator Mitsui* Second.
- Senator Mitsui* Good evening members of the Senate, the reason why I’ve introduced this resolution is that we’ve been facing a series of tuition increases here at the University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa. I really wanted to do something about this by placing a freeze, a moratorium on tuition.
- Senator Mandado* I would like to say that I support this resolution and that we as a Senate should be taking action on rising tuition.
- Senator Cox* Motion to change replace “total student debt” with “total outstanding student loan debt”.
- Senator Tegman* Second.
- Motion Carries.
- Senator Mitsui* Motion to add, under the 3rd WHEREAS from the bottom on the first page, “WHEREAS, in fiscal year 2013, the University of Hawai‘i Foundation reported over \$16.8 million dollars where allocated to student aid; and, WHEREAS, 72% of all students were eligible for financial aid, meaning that 28% of students had to pay through other means; and,” with appropriate citations.
- Senator Mandado* Second.
- Motion Carries.
- Senator Burk* Some of the discussion that is defiantly warranted is that we should definitely be encouraging the legislature to address tuition. But I have a problem on this is that this is placing a cap on tuition for at least one academic year. I encourage everyone to think about the implications beyond just “my tuition is going up”. Quite frankly, we don’t want to create a situation where the university is cutting into other means to make up for the lack of tuition revenue that affects overall student life. Keep in mind that there is a lot more in play than just my tuition is going up. You have to think about the way that tuition revenue is disbursed throughout the university.
- Senator Mitsui* I’m really glad you brought up that point. What this and our next resolution does is that it resolves the financial situation by implementing a financial audit.
- Senator Burk* Is the passage of one of these resolutions contingent on the other?
- Advisor Manini* In the 7th whereas, you are using the term local, where resident may be appropriate.
- Senator Mandado* Motion to change all instances of “local” to “resident”.
- Senator Moran* Second.
- Motion Carries.

- Senator Mandado* I think we should really address this. We should be focusing on access to higher education. I don't think tuition should be going up, especially for local students – I mean resident students, and that we have to look at the bigger picture.
- Senator Moran* I would like to address Senator Burk's concerns. In the 3rd "Be it Resolved" – you can say it is a non-binding resolve, but it is just as binding as capping tuition.
- Senator Burk* One of the concerns that were brought up in committee was the fact that many other schools were cited. One of the things that we asked was the research of the status of the success or not of these programs. I'm just curious, because one of the things that we've asked was to find any type of publications that look into the effects of these tuition freezes and if they have been successful.
- Senator Mitsui* The reason why I added this was to bring awareness of the issue. Senator Burk, just like your special session bill, you addressed other states that have supported same-sex marriage, not to support them, but to bring awareness.
- Senator Kwon* In the External Affairs Committee, one of the concerns was that if financial aid had fluctuated with tuition – do you have any opinions on that?
- Senator Mitsui* That is why I added the prior whereas statements. Financial Aid has been relatively stable and if tuition does go up, the students that do not receive financial aid are hit harder.
- Senator Mandado* I think if you ask any student out there, if they would support a tuition freeze, the answer would be yes. So this is a no brainer and everyone should vote yes.
- Treasurer Tomono* I have a quick question – if they were to implement a tuition freeze and we want the legislature to compensate, when will they have to decide to give funds to UH?
- Senator Burk* This is another concern in regards to the budget. That is in regards to the general funds that are allocated to the university. The budget would actually have to be revised to the university.
- Senator Kwon* Motion to add a 4th "be it resolved" "the 101st ASUH Senate urges the University of Hawai'i, the Board of Regents and the State Legislature to explore alternatives to reducing the financial burdens of students, not limited to a moratorium".
- Senator Burk* Second.
- Senator Burk* I support Senator Kwon's amendment – ideally this is a piece of legislation that we would take to the legislature to lobby for.
- Motion Carries.
- Treasurer Tomono* I feel like this gives more pressure to the university to downsize as opposed to pressuring the legislature to give us more money.
- Senator Burk* There has been dialog about these transition phases. I wouldn't want anything to happen to increase the amount of time for these projects. I agree with Senator Mandado that if you ask any student if they support any increase their expenses, they would say no. But I don't think many students see the effects of tuition on the university.
- Senator Burk* Motion to amend the title to "In support of a moratorium on tuition increase at the University of Hawai'i Mānoa for the 2014-2015 academic year, and to explore in conjunction with the Hawaii state leg alternative means to tuition increase".
- Senator Kwon* Second.

Senator Mitsui I would not like to change the title.

Senator Burk The title seems to mislead about the moratorium until it gets to the end.

Senator Kwon I agree with Senator Burk, because the highest chance of the legislatures reading this would be the title. It would give the legislation a higher feel of totality.

Senator Mandado I encourage everyone to nay this motion.

Senator Kwon I'm going to repeat again, Senator Burk's amendment is going to make this resolution friendlier to all solutions.

Senator Mandado I still think everyone should nay this motion. And you're changing the title and the author disagrees with it.

Senator Mitsui I'm open to it.

Senator Burk I call the question on the motion.

Senator Mitsui The one in the packet is the first introduced version and the one that is stapled is the one I would like to make additional amendments to. This resolution goes in conjunction with 20-14 and 21-14 explores the financial situation of the university with a financial audit.

Senator Mitsui Motion to replace, in the 3rd WHEREAS “funds” with “revenue”, “expense” with “tuition”, add before “tax-payers” “general funds from the State Legislature collected from the”, add after the 3rd WHEREAS “WHEREAS, tuition and fees charges at all University of Hawai‘i campuses are subject to change in accordance with requirements of State law and/or action by the Board of Regents or the University administration; and 1st”, add after the now 7th WHEREAS “WHEREAS ASUH recently so-supported a ill to fund a March on the Capitol to bring more attention to the dire financial situation that students have to have as a result of the tuition increases; and, WHEREAS, a financial audit would help streamline the University’s operations, thus reducing costs; and,” and add is the now 10th WHEREAS after “state auditor” “, the Legislature initiated a systemwide financial audit of the University of Hawai‘i general funds and accounts and non-general funds and accounts through House Concurrent Resolution No. 213, 2005 Regular Session; and,” , add in the now 11th WHEREAS before “UH-Mānoa’s budget” “according to the findings of this 2005 audit,” , add in the beginning of the now 12th WHEREAS “additionally,” , replace in the now 17th WHEREAS “board of regents” with “Board of Regents”, add after the now 17th WHEREAS “WHEREAS, this could be done through a financial audit, which is defined as a planned and documents activity performed by qualified personnel to determine by investigation, examination, or evaluating of objective evidence, the adequacy and compliance with established procedures, or applicable documents, and the effectiveness of implementation; and, 4th , replace in the now 19th WHEREAS “wasteful management” with “financial mismanagement”, add in the now 19th WHEREAS after “through this audit” “, and by following through the recommendations,” , add after the now 19th WHEREAS “WHEREAS, the funds for administering this audit shall be appropriated from the State

- Legislature; and,” replace, in the first, second and third BE IT RESOLVED, all instances of “Senate of the Associated Students of the University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa (ASUH)” with “ASUH”, and replace in all appropriate instances, in the FINALLY, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, “UH” with “UHM”.
- Senator Mandado* Second.
- Motion Carries.
- Senator Mandado* In the SCR, the President voted nay on the measure. Can he please explain why?
- President Mizusawa* Yes, I’ve done my research in regards to this. We do have an internal auditor and we do have an external auditor. If the university went through an audit through the state leg, it would be just extra money that would already be conducting.
- Senator Mitsui* The reason why I am introducing is to settle the once and for all.
- Senator Cox* The second page of the draft mentions that this auditor would be conducted by the state auditor. Have there been any results since then?
- President Mizusawa* The external audit is about every three years and the internal audit does different sections of the university.
- Senator Burk* To conduct an audit takes a lot of time and resources away from regular university operations. I think this would draw out time and money and create a lag in operations.
- Advisor Manaini* Has the introducers researched and looked into both internal and external audit results to stipulate an additional source from the state to come in and look at it. It cost \$35,000.00 to audit our student accounts.
- President Mizusawa* During our audit, it took a lot of time out of our hands that could have been used otherwise.
- Senator Burk* An audit is not a quick thing. I’d be surprised if this audit would be completed within the year.
- Vice-President Koethe* In regards to the 2005 audit, were you able to get the results from it.
- Senator Mitsui* Yes, but I did not want to bombard this resolution with too many facts.
- Senator Burk* Considering an audit of the university would cost at least hundreds of thousands of dollars, they would be doing a disservice to taxpayers, where the money could be used to pay for fixing highways.
- Senator Mitsui* I agree with you, there is going to be a financial cost. But I believe that in the long run, it would lead to a saving. Why not go through this assessment and then transfer the money?
- Senator Burk* If this audit was conducted 9 years ago, have you read the audits between now and then that shows that the university has not been managing its money well? Sure, there have been issues but there have been changes in administration, so they are responding to these public issues.
- Senator Moran* Given that there is an audit conducted every three years, I don’t see why this resolution is really necessary.

- Senator Wainwright* Yeah I agree. Before, when I first read this, I didn't know that there already was an external audit conducted. Now that we know that there is an external audit, it seems really unnecessary. We should just focus on just getting that past external audit results.
- Senator Callihan* Yeah, I agree. Is going to say that if we want to work on transparency, I think there can be another resolution that can better address transparency and that his resolution is kind of contradictory in that sense.
- Senator Mandado* If you were to just read the be it resolved sections, it clearly states what this resolution is asking for.
- Treasurer Tomono* What makes having a state auditor any different than our current external auditor or internal auditor?
- Senator Mitsui* From the assessment point, if the assessments are positive or negative, there can be follow up hearings. Because at this point I feel like it is not transparent.
- Advisor Manaini* All audits are public information, you just have to request it.
- Senator Burk* To address Senator Mandado's concerns, yes they do address things that ASUH should support but an audit is not necessary a solution.
- Senator Moran* Call the question.
Senator Lee Second.
- Senator Mandado* Everyone should support this.
- Senator Burk* Everyone should not support this.
