Official Correspondence

a. Interim Chancellor Robert Bley-Vroman

Chancellor Bley-Vroman Thank you for having me. The experience at the university is partly going to classes and graduating. This is the part of the university experience that is most prominent in education today. This is only one part and maybe in retrospect, is not the most important part. It's not just about the academic side, it's about the whole experience. Bonnyjean Manini knows what I'm talking about. The university has a responsibility to do more than just offering courses, which you take to get a degree as quickly as you can. We need to find a way to value that aspect of the education experience. When we say there's a Manoa experience, we mean more than just getting a degree.

Advisor Manini I think you're asking them as students if there is a shared collective experience that no matter what their major is, that they all share as being a part of this campus. Is that it or not?

Chancellor Bley-Vroman Well, I don't know if there is such a shared thing. It's possible there is something but it's also possible that there is no shared thing of the Manoa Experience.

Senator Mandado I'm a senior and I think for many students, we don't have complaints about going to class but once we leave class. We have a negative image in the media and that's where most students get their information from. The university sucks in this way because of administration. But I think one aspect from my Manoa Experience was studying abroad and having that resource available.

Chancellor Bley-Vroman I reflect on how good of a job we are doing. Whatever the Manoa Experience is, we don't want that experience to just be going to class. You mentioned the media and how they say, not always, often messages that Manoa sucks. Fortunately, it's not the students that is receiving that. Our job as administrators is be less sucky.

Senator Zhang How can your Manoa experience be good if you can't talk to your academic advisor for a whole month? Some advisors are getting pay cuts and can't be accessible.

Chancellor Bley-Vroman This is a resource problem. I gave a talk to the BOR last time. We have buildings where we have deferred maintenance. We have a deferred maintenance problem with advising. We should have a scheduling system worked out for advising. We need to work on recruitment and advising as our primary focuses.

Senator Nguyen There has been concerns about student representation on the () search committee. What was your mind set going on about setting up that search committee? For future search committees, will you include student representation?

Chancellor Bley-Vroman The Athletics Director has a unique roll in that search process. Our normal search process includes all aspects of perspective, especially from students. For every other search, there will be student representatives like it always has been. Athletics itself has a different relationship to the university. It's a different kind of entity. The athletics search is a very tight recruitment and for that, there is a very small committee. When you have a really tight search like that, there are ways to get student input without having a student representative on it. You don't have the membership on the committee, but the student

voice still needs to be heard. If you have any more questions, please let me know. I look forward to coming back to ASUH and talking with you more.

President Nishihara

Thank you Chancellor. Up next, we will be hearing from the testifiers.

Anthony Primer

The fossil fuel companies that we invest today are the companies that promote inequality, exploitation, and degradation to the environment. By prolonging investing into fossil fuels, you are making a case against these things.

Jess Sevilla

The university's mission is to promote sustainable values. Since the industrial revolution, our climate has been drastically changing. As a university we should be committed in preserving our future and the well-being of the next generation. We must act now even if it means it is going to affect us financially.

Doora Shin

I am here to oppose SR 01-15 and I would like to start off by saying that underperformance from divesting from fossil fuels is a myth. This is because when you divest from fossil fuels, you are divesting from dirty energy that comes from an already dying industry. Therefore, divesting would be beneficial to the portfolio. GSO and the Board of Regents have already unanimously supported divestment, so I think it is a little ridiculous to have to come to ASUH to testify on why we should divest from fossil fuels. The divestment movement is about compassion and it is about preserving the planet that we live in. All we have to do is support the administration on this issue.

Zach Parlee

I am here in opposition to SR 01-15. We need to set a precedent for what is right and hope you will all join us.

Kristin Jameson

Climate change has been a constant threat throughout my education. I think it is hypocritical to be teaching these things in classes and we are not putting our investments into better options. Fossil fuels will no longer be needed in the future, therefore we should do divest from fossil fuels.

Mark Ryan

There is a huge divestment for divestment in numerous places. I am a little embarrassed for having to make the case for divestment when the BOR already made its decision to do so. Climate change is definitely a threat and we must act as soon as possible. In an economical sense, divestment is the good option since we could put that money into alternative energy sources which would generate more money in the long-run. I question who is pulling the strings on this anti-divestment movement. We should move away from politics and come into an agreement soon.

Kelsey Barrow

I think we should move onto the future and lessen our carbon footprint.

Emilie Bierly

Divestment is causing a great movement across the board. Many institutions and government have already divested globally. Climate is changing and we should not think about what are our viable options, but we should think about preserving our future. Securing our assets may be a good idea, but it is not the good one.

Karen Nicole McGhehey

I'm here on behalf of the LGBT center and am here to testify in support of SR 14-15. I think having unisex bathrooms is the important step to take to make this a more welcoming place of learning.

Eurielle Blair

I'm a little shocked since at the BOR meeting there have been many experts for the case of divestment. Therefore, we should move forward and go along with this movement.

Michelle Tigchelaar GSO already introduced a resolution in support of divestment. Climate change is already a big problem especially here in Hawaii. One of the way we can solve this problem is by divesting from fossil fuels. It seems to me that it is hypocritical to benefit from these companies when they are mostly liable for wrecking our planet. As a university, it is time to put our money where our money is and divest from fossil fuels. This is about sending a message that we do care about sustainability. Your returns will not go down from divesting at all.

BJ Avery I am here to talk about the issue of gender-neutral bathrooms. Every bathroom at this campus can be changed just by changing the sign, therefore the cost is very minimal. This is about protecting those who are bisexual, transsexual etc. We need these people to be able to use bathrooms comfortably. I also want to talk about divestment. I learned that we already had the technology to convert to alternative energy sources, but we just lacked the political and social will. If you will be that change, that will be really great, and we should do this.

Camaron Miyamoto I am the coordinator of LGBT student services. I believe this is a good thing, and you as ASUH are willing to make this a better place to learn. Thank you for taking on this issue and encourage you to pass it.

Kaleo Ramos I am a teacher at the DOE. I am in support of SR 14-15. I encourage everyone to support this resolution and support people who are transsexual to be able to use bathrooms comfortably. This will bring us closer to some of the federal guidelines and policies.

Senator Schulz So in discussing the next resolutions, the president has the authority to limit each speaker to talk only two times. The first time you speak, you can speak up to 2 minutes, and the second time will be for 30 seconds. Please keep in mind Rule 22-2(b). Just know that the President has the power to stop you if you go over the said times.

Advisor Manini I want to make sure that Krista Ann Lee introduces Merrill Lynch. In no means did they entertain this resolution. We will not be going with them after February, and they are not going to profiting at all regardless of if you decide to invest into fossil fuels or not.

Senator-at-Large Lee As advisor Manini said, Kirk is here and he is our financial advisor. This resolution is for not limiting our ASUH investments and stadium stock funds and be able to trade in all legally tradable stocks. This means that we should be able to freely invest in where we want. This money is used to fund 77% of our budget and it should not be used to reflect our social values. I would like to say that the BOR did not unanimously support divestment, and they only created a taskforce to look at the issue and if they did support it, they would have created a policy that would pass and said they will be divesting. And as advisor Manini was saying, Merrill Lynch had no influence in me bringing up this resolution. It was in response to SR 11-15.

Senator Kwon I have a question for Merrill Lynch. What percentage of our portfolio is invested in fossil fuels?

Kirk Taniguchi 6.5% of your portfolio which is about \$500,000.

Senator Uyeda How important is our investment on fossil fuels?

Kirk Taniguchi It's to diversify your assets.

Senator Wainwright If we didn't invest in the energy sector, what would be the next thing to invest in?

Kirk Taniguchi We would just invest money to the rest of the portfolio or rest of the market.

Senator Shon Are there other clean energy sources that we can invest in?

Kirk Taniguchi I'm not sure on the top of my head. There are alternative energy sources to invest in, but also I would like to say that these fossil fuel companies actually invest a lot into alternative energy sources. If you eliminate one, you eliminate both benefits from your portfolio.

Senator Mitsui This resolution is just saying that we should not limit ourselves in how we invest our own money. If the time comes and these alternative energy sources do seem to be lucrative, we might invest in them. However, this is a conversation that we should be having another time, but in the meantime, please support this resolution.

- Senator Shon* Can you explain what you mean by not limiting ourselves?
- Senator-at-Large Lee* Basically when you say that you want to divest from fossil fuels, you are limiting us in how we can invest our own money. This could go against our own policy by not being as diversified, as we have to be.
- Senator Kawagishi* Just for clarification, this is to open up discussion for any investment trends that are going on, and to not necessarily be able to say how the future senate should invest its own money.
- Senator Uyeda* If we pass this, does this conflict with the other resolution?
- President Nishihara* Yes, and that is why I asked for the 7-minute recess to assess how we should all vote on these resolutions.
- Senator Nguyen* From a business perspective and a person involved with security as this, we shouldn't be limiting ourselves in what to invest in. Something like this will make our portfolio less appealing for future investors and will limit us in competition in regards to returns. Oil is at an all time low and if the trend goes up, we will miss that if we divest in fossil fuels.

- Senator Shon* I wrote this resolution and I want to ask Kirk from Merrill Lynch on what he means by energy being mixed in fossil fuels. Please read the 4th WHEREAS, the 1st WHEREAS in the back. So, as a political science major, I just want you to let you know the cultural impact this resolution has. The reason why gas is so cheap right now is due to the approval of the Keystone pipeline, but there are many other energy projects going on. I urge all of you to pass this resolution.
- Kirk Taniguchi* Energy companies such as Exxon and Shell produce fossil fuels, but they also produce clean energy sources and invest into them.
- Senator Nguyen* The reduction in the recent oil prices is not due to the Keystone pipeline. It has only been approved and not even built yet. The reason why is because of OPEC, and since there is much more supply now, the price of gasoline went down. In regards to the resolution, I was wondering where you got the statement from the former member of the SEC? Since I feel like his message was misconstrued. I never also heard of the APERIO investment management.
- Senator Shon* If you want more information of where these information came from, I can just give it to you later. This is a complex issue and I just need more time to explain if I have to.
- Senator Kawagishi* Is it possible to come to a compromise rather than saying that we should immediately divest from fossil fuels? Is it possible to just recommend a more sustainable resource?
- Senator Shon* I'm open to discussion if wording is something that you would like to talk about.
- Senator Kawagishi* I believe the conflict is that this resolution mandates how we should invest, and I think it would not be a problem if we were just recommending other means of investments.
- Senator Shon* If we were to immediately stop investing into fossil fuels, how would that be detrimental to our portfolio?
- Kirk Taniguchi* It will reduce the diversification in your portfolio.
- Senator Mitsui* I know that we have been having this discussion on what the best investment option is, and we have no way of determining that on the spot. This issue is a lot more complex than just an environmental one. If we were to adopt some form of change every single time these things come up, that will incur a huge cost on our part, and we will lose money. Also, divesting from fossil fuels does not necessarily mean you are saving the environment since these are the companies that are investing into alternative energy sources.
- Senator Shon* I have a clarification. I am asking the financial questions to better understand what it means to divest. Approving this resolution means that you show support for this movement.
- Senator Wainwright* This resolution does not necessarily talk about our own investments portfolio.
- President Nishihara passes the gavel to Vice President Zakimi.*
- Advisor Manini* I need you to understand that your portfolio is a UH portfolio. Your portfolio is not different from UH foundation's portfolio, they are the same.

- President Nishihara* If you look at the intent of both of these resolutions, they come into conflict. If the senate is to pass both of these resolutions, I would be in a really tough position when having to testify for both of these resolutions.
- Senator Wainwright* I motion to table this resolution indefinitely.
- Senator Shon* I motion for everyone to work with me on this resolution if you have any problems since it represents your constituents.
- Advisor Manini* This is not a motion that could not be made. If you would like to work collaboratively, you should table this resolution and work from there.
- Senator-at-Large Lee* If you would like to work on it, you should table it. If we vote against this resolution, we will not be able to revisit this resolution ever again.
- President Nishihara* If we do vote against this resolution, it can still be brought up again in the next semester. However, it is going to be same argument since we already passed SR 01-15.
- Secretary Belisario* I think the language in this resolution is too negative ad should include more positive things. It should include language about the different efforts, projects, and ways UH is doing to be more sustainable. Also, mention something about the windmills that are on this island and other islands. Just to put it into perspective, ¼ of the island of Lanai is made up of windmills that generate enough energy to supply just Waikiki. Wind is a source of renewable energy but are these windmills effective enough to satisfy our sustainable expectations? If you nay this resolution, it does not mean that you are against sustainability and that you are still open to other sustainable resources.
