President Dela Cruz By the end of the week. The event is on July 11th, which is coming up. We could even

ask general questions such as how they are planning to support students at UH Manoa. If you folks really do want to submit questions, please submit them to me by Friday so I can

give them to the Manoa Neighborhood Board.

b. ASUH Leadership Kick-off Follow-Up

I wanted to follow-up with the Leadership Kick-off. Interim Secretary Sakamoto created a summary of everything we talked about on both Monday and Wednesday. Attached is the document. This is not finalized because I did want to give the opportunity to those who are on-leave to contribute their thoughts about what we talked about at the Kick-Off. We discussed ASUH's vision and mission. The first page is a general consensus on what we agreed to work on as a Senate to fulfill the vision and mission. Highlighted are key terms in everyone's statement that they shared. As you can see, a lot of it is about transparency, making a long-lasting impact, supporting each other, collaboration, getting to know our students more, and what not. In addition, we also talked about how our individual committees could fulfill the vision and mission. This shows what each committee spoke about and I also highlighted some key things. For example, more events planned by Campus Life, Elections spoke about getting more student participation, Student Affairs wants to be more in touch with our students. This gives us a general idea of not just what our duties are in our committees, but our general goals. Following this, we went into a deeper discussion on how we can actually fulfill all of the different things we want to achieve. This third page shows the specific steps we would have to take in order to fulfill what is written on pages one and two. It is broken up by different path steps. These are similar to last year, such as focusing on ASUH's visibility and engagement, effective communication both internally and externally, and involvement

and support. Under all of these items are different tactics on how we can achieve the different path steps. We talked about RIO presentations, more effective tabling, utilizing more engaging content online, having a suggestion box. It is all listed on pages three and four. We also each talked about our individual goals and initiatives we want to work on whether if it's for ourself or as a Senate. You can see everyone's individual goals that they set for themselves. This is really important for all of us. By knowing each other's goals, we can hold each other accountable for the progress that we make in achieving these different goals. If we find each other not working on these different things, we can help each other by reminding ourselves of what goals we had set. If you didn't bring up how you plan to fulfill the vision and mission at the Kick-Off and one goal or initiative for yourself, please be sure to add it to this document. I'll mention this to everyone who's on leave so they can do this too. Don't feel too stressed out about focusing on these goals and initiatives in addition to your committee work. This is supposed to benefit us so we can better serve our constituents. The "In the Now" page shows issues we should keep on our radar that may need ASUH's attention presently or during the school year. Following that are initiatives we want to see ASUH start on. We do have a really long list, so this shows that we are ambitious. Some are not too time consuming and some I think are things that we can achieve. If any of these things are of interest to you, feel free to take that on as your own personal goal or initiative that you want to work on. From this list, we figured out the token items that we really want to invest our time in. This page shows what those things are. We discussed more mental health services that meet the demand, establishing an OER grant program to incentivize faculty to incorporate OERs in their courses, wanting to have a transparent breakdown of student tuition and fees. These are initiatives ASUH would work on and invest our time into. We also listed initiatives we would like to work on, but it could be more of a co-sponsorship where we don't necessarily plan it, but rather have a hand in it with another group on campus. First we have the reusable utensil campaign. We discussed how we can work with the Surfrider Foundation since that is their expertise. We could provide promotional items that are reusable to help promote that culture on campus. We could also help share research done by the Surfrider Foundation. Another initiative, which I'm not too sure if this would be a co-sponsorship or something we could do on our own, would be to get a student discount on inter-island airfares since there is no longer that option. Students are travelling all the time between islands for school-related purposes. We also discussed supporting the homeless student population on campus since we do have a homeless population amongst our constituency. I am not personally aware of any support services that there are here. If there aren't any, I think this is a good bandwagon to jump on to help support. I wanted to bring this discussion back to the table to give you all the opportunity to discuss anything you have in mind after the Kick-Off. Feel free to share anything you want to add or if you see an initiative that you want to work on I can put your name down.

I would like to help Senator Lao with the transparent breakdown of student tuition and fees.

I already included names of individuals who expressed interest in these different initiatives. If your name is not on here that is totally fine. We still have time. When the time does come around, Vice President Simeona is going to arrange a strategy chart workshop where we learn about the strategy chart, which will really help create plans for the different initiatives that we want to work on. By then, you all should have an idea of what initiative you want to work on, so you can be part of the strategy discussion. For the issues to keep on our radar section, we could include the Shidler merger.

Senator Lao The revision that we reviewed today in our meeting was clarifying whether it is the Chair

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The revision we went through today was aiming to make it the Chair's responsibility. We discussed it and our thoughts are that we believe it would be more ideal if it were the Vice Chair's responsibility because the Vice Chair already takes minutes and has access to the attendance record on the minutes.
