Otherwise, we're going to let them know that we don't have any feedback and then they'll proceed with going to the Board of Regents who could potentially approve of this fee increase.

I would like to know your preferences. You joined ASUH for a reason, so I want to be sure that you're on committees that are aligned with that. Please fill that out as soon as possible.

b. Workshops

VP Simeona

I'm going to go over the list of workshops that every Senator has to go through. ASUH 101 is an introductory workshop to what ASUH is. That's going to be held on either Friday, November 16th or Saturday, November 17th. This is only for new Senators. The next 2 workshops are going to be clumped together. We're going to have a MidWest Academy Follow-Up. Earlier in the summer we had the MidWest Academy Workshop where we decided what 4 initiatives we're going to be spearheading this year, which are OERs, reusable utensils, mental health, and transparency with fee increases. This is going to happen first. After that is our bill and resolution writing workshop. You'll be learning how to write bills and resolutions. This will happen after the MidWest Academy Workshop. On November 21st is going to be a follow-up workshop for Chairs and Vice Chairs at 5:00 PM. I'm still working with Advisor Sonoda-Pale on the office operation workshop. We will also have our Fall Retreat, which I will be coordinating with the other 3 officers.

c. Fall Retreat - Schedule

As Vice President Simeona mentioned, your Exec Officers will be planning your Fall Retreat. It's a fun experience where we can come together and bond and do fun activities. We just want to schedule it on a weekend where everyone, if not everyone then almost everyone, can attend. Each semester we have a Fall and Spring Retreat to help with our leadership development and to also increase our progress in the work that we do. I have four dates here on the whiteboard. The retreat is projected to be an all day event and may or may not be here on campus. We might go somewhere via a bus that we'll rent out.

e. UH Student Caucus Update - November

VP Simeona

This past weekend, I went to the UH Student Caucus. The UH Student Caucus has representatives from each campus in the UH system. Usually the President and Vice President from each campus attends. One of the main topics that we did talk about was the Candidate Advisory Council for the BOR. Currently there is no student representative in those conversations regarding the next BOR candidates. The BOR stands for the Board of Regents. They oversee the UH system. Within these next short days, I will be sending out a letter to the BOR for Caucus's stance on having a student rep in that position.

Another thing that was discussed was something that happens every 2 years, which is a request from the University for legislative funds. The University already created a budget proposal called the Fiscal Year Biennium Budget for 2019-2021. In this request they put specific items they want legislative funding for for all 10 campuses. With Student Caucus being the voice for all students within the entire system, they'll be working on a resolution in support or suggestions to add to the legislative budget request.

VP Simeona

UH Mānoa is potentially going to be going through a reorganization. UH Student Caucus is reinstating their stance on opposing the merger between the UH President and Mānoa Chancellor. Another discussion was the Mauna Kea rule change. Because of the protestors, Caucus is trying to navigate and see where we can take our stance.

To help educate the campus community about this, next semester the committee wants to host a series of workshops. Each month they're going to host a different workshop on a different topic. The Marketing department wants to put together a committee of students to work on these different events and talk about different ways we can increase student engagement with Athletics. They reached out to ASUH because they would really love if a few ASUH members were to be on this committee. Because we are the biggest advocate for undergrad students, we would hopefully know what students want and how to get our students out to athletic events. If you would be interested in working directly with Athletics' Marketing department, let me know and I can put you in contact with the person in Marketing who is in charge of that. I think this is a great opportunity for us to get students involved with Athletics. I think athletics plays a huge role in the college experience so I think this is a great opportunity for us. If ASUH does get involved, we would have the opportunity to co-sponsor events and hand out ASUH promotional items. This would be a great opportunity for us to advertise our organization. If you are interested in this, let me know and I can put you in contact with the person in charge.

a. Event: Mahalo Mānoa

Chairperson Chun

Just a reminder that Mahalo Manoa is on November 15th, Thursday, from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM. Shirts will be delivered to the office next Monday, November 12th. Please post the advertisements on your social media. Sinclair Study Nights is during the week of finals, December 9th to December 14th, from 10:00 PM to 11:30 PM. We have our menu set. If you have any questions about the menu, you can click on the link on my report. Our next official meeting is next week Wednesday, November 14th. One of our issues is that we don't have a lot of volunteers for Mahalo Mānoa, but we did get new volunteers just today. If you guys haven't volunteered yet, please do so after this meeting so I can assign you a task. This is the action plan for Mahalo Manoa. It has all of the tasks and assignments for all of the volunteers. Starting from 3:00 PM is going to be the set-up. From 3:00 PM to 3:30 PM, make sure the tables are arranged according to the diagram. Make sure you cover the ASUH table with the table cover, pick up the ID scanners from James, and place all the required materials on the table. Next to the ASUH table is going to be the food pantry table. It's going to be like an assembly line. They'll check-in then go to the food pantry table. I'll prepare the 6 empty boxes for donations. Make sure you have the t-shirt vouchers, the food pantry signs, and display non-perishable goods and toiletries as acceptable items. Next to the food pantry table will be the t-shirt table, which will be 2 tables. 2 people will be at each table Organize the shirts from small to XXXL. Smalls and medium will be on the first table and large to XXXL will be on the second table. For audio/visual equipment, we're just going to have someone's phone or iPod play music. We have a playlist that has school-appropriate music. There will be 3 tables for food. From 3:30 PM to 4:00 PM, put the water and ice into the coolers and the mixed drink into the other. Prepare the drink coolers right next to Sodexo. When you're with Sodexo, make sure you introduce yourself, tell them you're part of ASUH, ask them if they need help with anything, and tell them that they can only serve to students with a wristband. At 3:30 we'll start playing music. There is going to be 4 activity tables. From 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM is the actual event. If you're at the ASUH table, make sure that they have their UH Mānoa ID with them. If we cannot verify their student status, you cannot let them in. Make sure you verify that using the ID scanners. Once you scan their IDs, explain to them what this event is about. We do not just plan events, but we represent them. We put forth initiatives that affect our constituents. At the food pantry table, explain to students the history of the food pantry. Collect their 4 non-perishable goods or toiletries. By doing that, they get a t-shirt voucher. If they already have a youcher, just move them along to the t-shirt line. There should be 2 people at each t-shirt table. Students only get one shirt. Encourage these students after they receive their shirt to participate in the activities and get food. There are 4 activities. One table will have the "Make a Guess" activity, which is a passive game. There will be 2 jars, one with candy corn and the other with Reese's Pieces. Students will have to guess how many are inside. For "Pin the Tail," there will be a cork board, cones, and rope. On the cork board will be a turkey. Students will have a pair of "drunk goggles," which impairs your vision. They'll have to pin the tail on the turkey. The next activity is called "Separation Anxiety Race." Students will have to separate 20 M&Ms into their respective colors into clear cups. The last game is "Make it to the Finish Line." There will be bottle caps and each person will have 1 bottle cap. You will have to flick the bottle cap to the finish line, however, it cannot cross the finish line. The bottle cap closest before the finish line wins. The breakdown is pretty self-explanatory. Take down all of the signs, table cloths, and everything. Thank Sodexo for always helping us. Also help MES. We usually leave, but I think we should help fold up the chairs and tables for them. I'll send the action plan next week once I have everyone's assignment. Please sign-up and I'll have you added to the action plan.

DTS to make sure that we keep reviewing the agreement. Our agreement right now ends Spring 2019. We're tying to get an in-person negotiation, however, they sent us an email negotiation. We don't want to have a negotiation over email. DTS emailed Chair Kim

asking if we'd be okay with the \$50.00 fee again.

Chairperson Kim Biki is supposed to be on campus already. I emailed Commuter Services and I'm waiting

for a response about that. We're working on advertisements for bringing in donations to the food pantry. SAL Chun and Senator Creadick have been planning on meeting with CSDC and have been working on a resolution regarding mental health. Our next meeting

is next Tuesday.

Treasurer Honda Can you explain why you've added condoms to the food pantry?

Chairperson Kim We're already giving out toiletries and since University Health Services is already giving

out condoms so we figured we give students another place on campus to get that.

Treasurer Honda Maybe we can consider changing the name of the Food Vault because if we're going to

be handing out toiletries too that can get kind of confusing.

Chairperson Kim There's a designated section in the food pantry designed for toiletries.

Treasurer Honda I also know a little bit about the Biki situation. The way Biki currently operates is that

Biki stops are in flat areas. The way bikes are distributed is people take it from place 1 to place 2. If you have Biki stops in a place like Mānoa, everyone is going to want to ride it downhill, they're not going to want to ride it uphill. What Biki would have to do is they would have to hire people to restock bikes and bring them back, which could increase the labor costs by a lot. The issue is that we're on a hill and people don't want to ride a bike

uphill.

Undergraduate Academic Affairs

Chairperson Hortizuela

Thank you to all of the volunteers for Grad Fair. For those who weren't able to volunteer, thank you for advertising the event. We are currently processing all of the scholarship applicants. We have about 54 applications that are being split between my 4 committee members. We're going to have a second round of folders to process after those. As soon as those applicants get processed, I'm going to send out all of the folders to our faculty reviewers, which they will score. I will be inputting these scores into a spreadsheet. Vice Chair Juliano sent an email to all of the Grad Fair giveaway winners to let them know that they can pick up their prize. An issue we are having is sometimes we are missing people's letter of recommendation or essay and that is because we ask for these documents to be submitted in a specific file format and sometimes people don't follow that. I will be contacting these people and giving them a deadline to get that in. To the new Senators, we are the Undergraduate Academic Affairs Committee. We oversee all of the scholarships and awards. Senator Ramirez Our promotional items are going to be used for something else. It's not t-shirts.

SAL Li We'll have promo items like towels, lunch bags, and other items that say ASUH on it.

Senator Creadick Since one event already has enough promo items, I think we should stick with less shirts.

Senator Hortizuela That still doesn't change the fact that we're promising shirts and both events. I think the

number of shirts is necessary even if it's a lot.
