Official Correspondence

a. House of Representative Takashi Ohno

Takashi Ohno Aloha! As I was sitting here, I was taking in how we govern ourselves. What you are doing is the same thing as what we are doing at the state legislature, expect we have laws and law enforcement. That is the same thing that happens at the national level. As you step up to represent your colleges, people step up to represent their states. One of the reasons why I am here is to talk about the Department of Education and examples of testimony. The state legislative session will begin on the third Wednesday in January. I saw that there is a resolution, which I think is really good and echos a lot of what we heard when I last came - a desire to have a well rounded curriculum. I made a dozen copies of the draft strategic plan. The Department of Education wrote a Strategic Plan five years ago. This year they are revisiting and rewriting it. They have goals and indicators in this plan. I think this is very succinct and organized. Does anyone have any questions on the strategic plan?

Senator Lao What does the Strategic Plan entail?

Takashi Ohno There are three goals: student success, staff success, and systems of support (e.g. computer systems, accountability systems to support students and teachers). Each of these goals is broken down into objectives they want to follow. I expect the future Board of Education to revisit this. These indicators are reported at least annually. When we talked about increasing the age of attendance into public schools, previously you could enter public schools at the age of 4.5. They changed it back to 5 years. Research shows that people who enter school younger perform worse. The data shows it might be wiser to wait until students are 5 years old before they enter the public school system. What happens is there are parents and people who have children who are exceptions. That's one story, but sometime it doesn't apply to everyone. We need to use data that whatever we have in the plan can be followed by some numbers.

Takashi Ohno I also wanted to talk to you about the process of testimony. The biggest way most people participate in democracy is through voting. Another way is there are committee hearings where we debate things. The fraction of people who vote versus people who testify is huge. More people vote than people who share their expertise. One way to share their expertise is through testifying. I hope you will testify at the Board of Regents on this Strategic Plan. I also hope that you testify at the state legislative session on decisions that will affect you.

Treasurer Hinshaw Is there an estimated cost to the Strategic Plan? Where will the resources come from?

Takashi Ohno The Strategic Plan is the direction the department wants to go in. The department will decide later what initiatives are necessary to complete the plan and their costs. The plan is not a budget, but says what we want to do. Every year, we'll come up with a more detailed plan stating what we want to do and what it will cost. In goal 2 or 3 they talk about modeling a successful teaching career to attract more teachers. This year, we were short around 390 teachers across the state, and we are trying to prepare legislation to curtail that problem. A lot of the vacancies are geographically centered around certain

parts of the island. There are other factors such as pay and workload that are in play here that affect teacher enrollment.

Takashi Ohno

One way you can participate in democracy is sharing your expertise through testimony. I have a couple of examples of testimonies that you can pass around. We will go over two examples of bad testimonies and two examples of good testimonies. This first testimony starts off well, however their position is not clear. This second testimony has no date, no heading and is a page and a half. From the beginning it is very hard to discern their position. This third example has a good heading so you know where it is from. It is concise to read. This last example clearly indicates who it's from. One of the things I like about this is that it states amendments. Some chairs respond well to this.

Senator Lao

So are the main takeaways from this that testimonies should be clear and concise and state specifics of the hearing?

Takashi Ohno

Yes. I hope you continue to weigh in on the Board of Education Strategic Plan and I hope to continue to see you. Thank you!
