a. Vice President for Academic Planning and Policy Rissa Dickson, Tuition Proposal

Vice President Dickson

Every so many years UH has to propose a tuition schedule. The purpose of this is to solicit feedback from you all. This presentation is a schedule in process and goals used to in the tuition setting process. The purpose is to get feedback from people in terms what your thoughts and ideas. We are going to be doing meetings on all campuses. We will use the feedback to make changes needed. The proposal will be presented to the regents in June. So there is a schedule in the beginning started shows where we are and the informational meeting with the board of regents. One of the biggest goals to ensure access, get access to education to Hawaii residents, keep tuition affordable and get the best education. The parameters of the proposal is that regents policy that all residents of Hawaii have the opportunity to receive education. We have to give community members to allow feedback and like to go out in a year of advance. This tuition start ins 2017-2018 and goes through 2020. The policy we have to look at five things one is relative standing compared to other institutions, different tuition rates, third is accessibility, fourth is availability and use, and how much students should pay. The fifth one is important there is two places education comes from are tuition and g-funds. This is a problem has risen where tuition funding nationwide is increasing. How do we compare to other intuitions? For Manoa we use two comparisons' that is WICHE, in terms of flagships like UCLA and Manoa is slightly expensive for residents and non-residents we are slightly above the median. In terms of Manoa when we look at undergraduate tuition, we find the average number is \$10,230 is a little above. We are higher then WICE and we see that the bars move. There is no increase in the medical or law school, professional schools. Locally how we compared, HPU and Chaminiade is much more expensive. We know that the residents tuition is average and non-resident is much higher. We know that professional schools are much higher in tuition. The second is the differential tuition rates and Manoa and community colleges we are much expensive compared to our flagship institutions. I wanted to point out that community colleges are by credit

hours, but the more credit hours you take the more you pay. 12 credits you are full-time. So we determine that there is no reason to focus on this. We found that pell recipients we track people non-residents and Hawaiian ancestry that use pell. So, we come in the conclusion that we want to have students to have more access around pell grants. We have an executive policy where money is put aside for scholarships. We are the only state that doesn't have a state financial aid. How much funding for financial aid money do we get? It depends on the enrollment of students in 2014-2015 we funded \$40 million of financial aid. We bring in \$66.9 million for federal financial aid historically. How much debt do students accumulate? Student average \$23,000 of debt. Nationally, Manoa average debt for students is \$22,000 and we are almost at the average. For the pell grants and cost of education you don't have to pay it back. We also have unmet need, there is a concern about the gap which students are not able to pay for school even with financial aid. In terms of general funds and tuition in fiscal year of 2008 there is small percentage of funding of education, not quite. General funds we have to raise tuition and someone has to pay. The money goes to operating funds, tuitions, personal is majority and electricity. Our institution has about 16,000 students. We found that in 2008-2015 the average education we dropped 25% in Hawaii. Only three states increased in appropriations. Hawaii still needs to be pretty funded. In 2014, 34% of students were paying their education. Most states is an average of 47%. It cost \$31,000 a cost to educate students. From the last decade Hawaii dropped in funding, we anticipate that funding will stay at the average levels. We have \$4 million deferred maintenance. The legislatures made it clear they are not giving us anymore money. We came up with the idea on how to use tuition to do maintenance. So we what we are thinking is reducing deferred maintenance using revenue bonds. The thing that is important is to use sinking funds. The three year schedule for tuition maintenance is 0% for the first year and then 2% at manoa at residents and two or more increase for non-residents. An increase of \$200,000 increase for the next 2-3 years. The summary from looking at the tuition schedule the increase would be 2% and help with deferred maintenance. These feedbacks will help us.

SAL Mitsui

Just looking at the tuition do you know how much pay out of pocket?

VP Dickson

When I first got here we did a financial aid deep dive. A percentage of students get financial aid, scholarships and pell grants. This is one of the things we are looking at. No matter how high we raise the tuition 56% of students will not be able to pay, 26% pay a couple hundred dollars.

Senator Chen

What are other UH tuition scholarships will it affect the regent and presidents still be paid for?

VP Dickson

Those students tuition will always be paid for.

Senator Chen

So would the scholarships increase for the tuition be increased as well?

VP Dickson

By your financial aid packaging.

Senator Jimenez

You mentioned the WICHE schools about resident and non-resident but you never mentioned the WUWE tuition. I feel like students out of state use the WUWE.

VP Dickson

Regardless of what the tuition is the WUWE will always be given to students.

- Senator Garma* What specific feedback are you looking for?
- VP Dickson* Basically anything and later in the end you will be able to give feedback.
- Senator Garma* There are whispers I heard from the legislatures about increase in fees and I think this is what I would do is 2% increase. Can we address deferred maintenance. It would be cool to have catalog of the maintenance based on the list which is much needed
- VP Dickson* We have asked for that from the chancellor.
- Senator Lao* I am curious why you kept enrollment at a constant and has decreased since 2012?
- VP Dickson* Nationally enrollment is dropping. We wanted to keep the money aside but needed the money to pay for bill. We need to keep students and think of efficiencies.
- Senator Sevilla* I was wondering which bodies would be deciding in the different maintenance projects.
- VP Dickson* I am not too sure, but the prioritization they are currently doing that. I cannot really answer that question.
- Senator Tacey* Would deferred maintenance include housing on campus?
- VP Dickson* I can't really answer that .
- Secretary Tagaban* Did we have a state financial aid program in the past?
- VP Dickson* Not that I am aware of, but we have something called B+ scholarships. Looking at that \$66 million of interest revenue.
- Senator Lao* Knowing tuition has increased between the last 10 years, its hard for me and looking at the operating funds and tuition. It seems like state general funds we are back to where we are in 2008.
- VP Dickson* In first time of higher education we are growing in administrative growth in IT and I can't specifically to this.
