VI. OPEN FORUM

A. Pres. Temperino: Our voice is very important in getting others interested in running for various positions

- 1. At the involvement fair, was able to give out 30+ packets
- 2. Mention perks of being in ASUH

B. Sen Pham:

- 1. Signature requirement may be putting people off
- 2. If they are freshmen and really interested, and want to hold a convo and learn that they are genuine, we can help students to attain the 25 signatures

C. Pres. Temperino: this rule is difficult due to the requirement of signatures needing to come from the same college as the candidate

D. Advisor Bonny:

- 1. Constitution is almost impossible to revise due to the 10% turnout and $\frac{2}{3}$ approval ratio - hasn't seen this type of turnout for 15+ years
 - a) Constitution allows from 25 signatures from the college or 25 signatures from the general student body if "at-large" position, OR to be floor nominated
 - b) Emphasize to prospective candidates that these options are both available and to not hesitate to inform ASUH and the Chair of Elections they would like to be floor nominated and for which vacant positions
 - c) In-person voting is likely part of the Senate rules rather than constitution
 - (1) This body would be able to amend such rules
 - (2) Revision needs to be introduced, vetted by this body, approve by $\frac{2}{3}$ vote
 - (a) Advisor Bonny will take a look before the Internal Affairs meeting

2. Revising the election rules should not be too difficult. It is a rule revision, not constitutional, to Advisor Bonny's knowledge.
