 Richard Mizusawa, Communication & Program Development Coordinator Counseling & Student Development Center (CSDC)

Richard Mizusawa

Hello, my name is Richard Mizusawa and I am the coordinator for Communication & Program Development for the Counseling and Student Development Center. I wanted to provide an overview of what the CSDC is and the programs and services that we offer. We provide a range of different counseling services for UH Mānoa students. To carry out this mission, we are responsive to the diversity of students in the UH community, as we have local, national and international students. We have 3 psychologists, 2 psychiatrists, and 8 staff therapists who are licensed to do mental health counseling. We also have 3 interns, and 2 office staff. We are not only a counseling center for students who come to us for mental health services, we also provide services that all UH Mānoa students can take advantage of. This is a listing of all the clinical services we offer. The first, the one that a majority of the people comes in for, is personal counseling. We also do couple's counseling, group counseling, and career counseling, which is different from what the Mānoa Career Center offers. We also offer peer fellowships and emergency/crisis services. During after-hours and on weekends, if you dorm, we have a counseling residence program, where we have counselors in the residence halls. These are the different group therapies that we offer and some of the workshops that we offer. We do different presentations like these for groups on campus. If you know an organization that would like to hear about our services, on our website we have an outreach request form. We offer our signature Love Life events every semester. On Monday, September 11, we will be doing an outreach event in honor of Suicide Prevention Week. This is an all-day event, where there will be different psychoeducational workshops. We will have other organizations, offices and prizes. In the Spring, we do a Healthy Relationships fair. For involvement, one way you can get involved with the CSDC is a Career Fellowship program, where we offer 5 fellowships to undergraduate or graduate students to provide psychoeducational programing and outreach. There is a \$2,500 per semester stipend. In the fliers, our number is listed. You can call or go online to make an appointment. You can follow us on social media. All of our social media includes tips and different mental health resources, things that every UH Mānoa student can find useful.

a. Senate Act 05-18: To Appropriate Funding for ASUH Business Cards

SAL Lao We are recalling this bill because there was a lot of discussion on this bill during the last

general senate meeting that was furthered in the last External Affairs meeting. It came to my attention that some people didn't want business cards, or if they did want business cards, they wanted them to be less personalized. The current language in this Senate Act doesn't permit this flexibility. I think it would be good for us to recall it and make the

necessary amendments.

existing funds in the ASUH Budget by authorizing the use of additional moneys towards the purchase of business cards for the ASUH 105th Senate. The cards shall serve as a compact and convenient means for each Senate member to provide contact information to

constituents and other parties.

SAL Chen Second.

SAL Leval What is the rationale behind generalizing the statement?

SAL Lao We decided as a committee that if everyone doesn't want business cards, they don't need

to have business cards. Regarding the last sentence, I don't think it's necessary to specify the contact information provided on the card since it is stated in the provision that the External Affairs committee is responsible for the design and purchase of the business

cards.

SAL Leval Given the controversial nature of this bill, I think the purpose statement should state our

aims for these business cards. If our aim is to have the flexibility to purchase

individualized business cards, or general business cards, the purpose statement should

reflect this.

SAL Lao I retract my motion.

SAL Leval Move to amend the last two sentences of Section I to read, "This measure supplements

existing funds in the ASUH Budget by authorizing the use of additional moneys towards the purchase of business cards for the ASUH 105th Senate. The cards shall serve as a compact and convenient means for Senate members to provide their personal contact information, committee contact information, or general ASUH contact information to

constituents and other parties."

SAL Chen Second.

Senator Utashiro Would it be possible to change "or" to "and/or" so senate members have the option of

choosing a mixture of the choices?

Senator Finau I think adding that would give members the option of having all three, which I don't

think is ethical.

Senator Utashiro I was concerned if someone wanted to create a hybrid between personal contact

information and general ASUH contact information.

Senator Lao The bill states that the External Affairs committee is responsible for the design of these

cards, and stating the option of "general ASUH contact information" provides some

flexibility.

Advisor Manini Generalized is a flexible term. A generalized design would just need to be approved by

the External Affairs committee.

Senator Finau From the External Affairs meeting, I was under the impression that a generalized

business card would just have the general ASUH office contact information

SAL Leval The purpose of putting in these different terms as well as a caveat to allow people to

choose what they want would be the most efficient way to spend this money.

VP Urasaki I think that the choice of hybridizing your business card could fall under a "personalized"

business card.

Senator Finau I agree that this is up to the discretion of the External Affairs Committee. I don't believe

that the discussion on hybrid talks was brought up in the External Affairs Committee, so I

felt that this discussion on hybrid cards should be brought up.

SAL Leval Move to call the question.

SAL Chen Second.

Motion carries.

SAL Lao Although the language has been changed, I do think that it is still open to interpretation

by the External Affairs Committee.

SAL Chen My suggestion would be to have the External Affairs Chairperson open up feedback to

what each individual wants.

SAL Leval I agree with SAL Chen. It has always been my intention to let the Senators decide what

they want on their business cards because only they have the ability to determine what information would be necessary to best reach out to the people these cards will be given

out to.

SAL Lao Move to reduce the line item for Business Cards from \$500.00 to \$300.00 and have the

totals reflect the changes.

SAL Leval Second.

SAL Lao This is because I have received the quotes, which ended up being a lot cheaper than

originally expected.

Advisor Manini If this bill is readopted, it is the job of the External Affairs Committee to implement this,

not to re-debate this.

Senator Utashiro Move to add under Section III that business cards can only be for purposes related to

ASUH.

Senator Finau Second.
